

What makes a successful One Degree referral?

- >Know the area in which the client needs services
 - Service Area (SA) or approximate geographic location
- >Thoroughly review the specific opportunity on the One Degree website
 - Some programs are limited by SA
 - Some services have specific eligibility requirements
 (ex: must already be receiving MHS, or have an open DCFS case)
 - Some services have specific referral requirements (ex: through DCFS, CES, or DMH)
- > Supply contact information for clients so they can be contacted directly

Intensive Services

- **≻**Referrals go through <u>DMH</u>
- > Can refer through One Degree for assistance

Team based comprehensive MHS for children and families

- **Child FSP** must have Serious Emotional Disturbance (SED) clients have not responded to traditional outpatient services or have acute history of hospitalization
- Wraparound must have open DCFS case and significant behavioral difficulties
- Adult FSP COMMERCE ONLY Must have Severe Mental Illness (SMI) Meant to increase their ability to function at optimal levels, decrease homelessness and incarcerations, and reduce unnecessary medical and psychiatric urgent care and emergency room visits and hospitalizations
- **IFCCS** must have open DCFS case and significant behavioral difficulties

Mental Health Services (MHS) - General outpatient

- > Can be self-referred through One Degree
- > Requires full-scope Medi-Cal
 - **Therapy** individual and/or family sessions provided in home, clinic, or schools
 - Can add adjunctive services such as:
 - Case Management connecting client to community resources to decrease barriers to treatment
 - TBS (Therapeutic Behavioral Services) short-term intensive 1:1 behavioral interventions in home, community, school as needed. Supports both client and caregiver. Can work in conjunction with outside agencies
 - Psychiatric services (medication management)
 - Psychological testing
 - Employment Support Services (ESP) NORTH HILLS ONLY



Substance Use Disorder Program (SUD) - Outpatient

- **Can be self-referred through One Degree** →
- > Requires full-scope Medi-Cal or My Health LA
 - Ages 12 years old and up
 - In-person and telehealth services available
 - Individual, group sessions, family therapy and case management services
 - Services in both English and Spanish



LGBTQ+ Tailored Services to Youth (TSY) Program

- **▶** Can be self-referred through One Degree
- **➤ Must have current or previous <u>DCFS case</u>**
 - Services for LGBTQ+ youth and young adults ages 2-25
 - Only in SA 1 & 7 Antelope Valley, East LA, Commerce, Whittier & surrounding areas
 - The program focuses on connecting youth to affirming services and supports
 - Services include: case management, mentorship, support groups, and collateral support



Transition Age Youth (TAY) Drop in Centers

- **Can be self-referred through <u>One Degree</u>**
- **➢Or just WALK IN during open hours**
 - Serves ages 16-25
 - Only in SAs 1 Antelope Valley and 7 -based in the City of Commerce
 - Each center provides a safe place for homeless youth to go and access services
 - On site offerings include: laundry, showers, computers with internet access, printing, hot meals, hygiene kits, clothing and weekly bus passes.
 - Sponsored events for community support (TAYstock, holiday events, etc)



Resource Family Programs

Adoption Promotion and Support Service (APSS) - SA 1 - ANTELOPE VALLEY

- > Must be a child in long-term foster care, a foster parent, a prospective adoptive parent, or a family that has completed an adoption.
 - case management, adoption-focused counseling and therapy, mentorship, support groups, etc.

Relative Support Services (RSS) - SA 2 - NORTH HILLS

- > For adults who are caregivers of related and non-related children
 - Specialized support services, including counseling, case management, utility and benefits assistance,
 job training, health care access, and legal services


Relative Home Assessment Services (RHAS) SAs 2 - NORTH HILLS & 7 - COMMERCE

- > For adult relative caregivers
 - support with initial home assessment for DCFS and ongoing inspections, as well as initial and ongoing training requirements



Housing Programs

- Must be referred through <u>COORDINATED ENTRY SYSTEM (CES)</u>
 - Transitional Housing for Emancipated Youth
 - Permanent Supportive Housing
- ➤ Must be referred through <u>DCFS</u>
 - Transitional Housing Placement Program Non-Minor Dependents (THPP-NMD)





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
