NLACRC is the **largest** of the 7 regional centers in LA County.

Every Regional Center has a specific catchment area.

South Central LA Regional Center/ SCLARC

North Los Angeles County Regional Center/NLACRC serves San Fernando Valley, Santa Clarita Valley, and Antelope Valley.

Application Process

An application can be submitted at any time and by anyone that has a concern regarding a developmental delay and/ or disability:

- Online
- In Person
- Fax
- By regular Mail

Once application is received, parent will need to provide signed consent to start evaluation process

Early Start continued

Developmental Delay

- 25% Delay in one or more of the following areas:
 - Cognition
 - Motor (Gross Motor and/or Fine Motor)
 - Expressive Communication
 - Receptive Communication
 - ° Self-Help
 - Social-Emotional




High-Risk and Established Factors

- Extreme prematurity and birth weight of less than 1500 grams
- Assisted ventilation for 48 hours or longer in the first 28 days of life
- Non-febrile seizures during the first three years of life
- Fetal Alcohol Syndrome
- Genetic disorders (Down Syndrome)

Individualized Family Service Plan/ IFSP

- •An initial IFSP takes place within 45 days from referral received and must take place at least every six months to assess, evaluate and measure the child's developmental progress.
- •New IFSP outcomes (goals) and services may change as the child's needs change.
- •Early Intervention services are provided as part of IFSP and can include Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, Child Development Services/ Parenting Education, etc.



Common services 0-36 months

Provisional Eligibility Program

All of the following must be met:

- Child is three or four years of age
- The disability is not solely physical in nature and the child has significant functional limitations in at least two of the following areas of major life activity:
 - Self-Care
 - Receptive and Expressive Language
 - Learning
 - Mobility
 - Self-Direction

Prior to age five (5), the child must be reassessed

Lanterman Act Services Eligibility Criteria after the Age of 3



Intellectual Disability

Autism

Epilepsy

Cerebral Palsy



Individual Program Plan (IPP)

- For individuals after age 3, an initial IPP must be conducted within 60 days from the time it is determined eligible for services under the Lanterman Act.
- An annual review is conducted as well but an IPP can be requested at any time by family

Common services 3-Adult



Daycare- Supervised daytime care to children in the home while the parent/caregiver is working or going to school.

Personal Assistance- Additional help in the home to provide care and supervision

Adaptive Skills- Teaches clients and parents how to reinforce the learning of a daily living skill

'Behavior Intervention- Strategies to help with behaviors that are challenging, socially inappropriate, or harmful

Social Skills- Teaches social skills to build relationships with family and friends

Self Determinatio n program

Allows participants the opportunity to have more control in developing their service plans and selecting service providers to better meet their needs.

Participants may use service providers that are not contracted by a regional center.



- Regional Center collaborates with local school districts within all our catchment areas to refer and advocate for children that qualify for special education services.
- NLACRC has an Educational Advocate/IDEA specialist who provides consultations for assistance to parents.
- Early Start department partners with schools to begin the transition process for special education services at 2 years 8 months of age.
