## **MLCP-LA Goals**

- Help for DHS Patients
  - Free legal help
  - Improve patients' wellbeing by addressing the social determinants of health.
  - Focus on interventions likely to improve health, safety, income, housing, and food
- Support for DHS care team to identify and address patients' legal needs
  - Training
  - Technical Assistance

# **Types of Help Available**

### **Patient Referral**

- Legal help for a DHS patient or their household member with a legal problem
- MLCP-LA works with patient and may engage DHS staff for support

## **Technical Assistance**

- General question related to barriers impacting patient
  - Is this an appropriate referral?
  - What income support exists for a patient who recently lost their job?

Services provided by legal team assigned to DHS clinical site where patient receives care.

# Steps to Legal Assistance

- 1. Patient at DHS clinical site presents with legal barriers
- 2. Care team refers patient to MLCP-LA through site-specific process (usually via BHI or social work) or patient self-refers
- 3. If available: BHI or SW screen for other social needs and refer to MLCP-LA
- 4. Legal team triages for urgency, explores common issues, conducts intake, and requests additional info or documents
- 5. Legal services offered vary based on merits of case, legal remedies available, patient capacity, and other factors. Types of services include:
  - a. Information, advice and brief service;
  - b. Connections to more appropriate resources;
  - c. Extended services and representation
