Through screening, treating, and healing, we aim to improve the health and wellbeing of LA County adults, children, and families, build creative connections, and inspire resilience.


Our Mission

Our Core Values

To build health equity through viable connections to community-based organizations so that families have access to dignified, affordable services to address, treat, and support improvements in their health outcomes.





To take ACEs screening to the next step, LA County DHS was awarded an 18-month grant to help connect DHS clinicians and programs with social services organizations throughout LA County so that they can jointly meet the needs of children and families impacted by toxic stress. The Network of Care works to:

- **1** Build an infrastructure to support screened and unscreened patients/families
- 2 Allow care/service providers/organizations to become aware of each other's work
- **3** Further promote the multidirectional and multidisciplinary relationships that are needed to address ACEs and toxic stress by focusing on the integration and improvements to technology such as One Degree

ACEs-LA oversees screening and treatment activities of DHS clinical sites and specialty clinics, as well as the development of IT infrastructure to support documentation in the Electronic Medical Record system for DHS, data analytics to track screening, strengthening referral pathways and partnerships with community stakeholders focused on addressing ACEs and toxic stress.

- Through our partnership with One Degree, we want to find ways to streamline referrals from our • clinics to CBOs so they are easily accessible and responsive.
 - By creating collections of CBOs on the One Degree platform, clinics, patients, and their families can access services like yours more easily.

Why do DHS clinics want to partner with CBOs?

• To **expand and enhance accessibility of services** and resources for children and their families, clinicians, and community partners

• To **promote equity** through attention to structural factors, cultural humility, resource access, and power sharing at all facets of the network's organization and function

• To take a **patient and family-centered approach** focused on the needs of low-income families who have been disproportionately impacted by longstanding marginalization and who have been hard hit by health and economic upheaval through the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.

• To **improve and promote the integration** of both health care services and the services, supports, and interventions provided by CBOs.

Who will benefit from the Network of Care?

This initiative will benefit our patients, their families, and the communities in which they live, work, and play. **Building resilience** through projects based in access, equity, and a family centered approach, will have a positive impact on all communities served.



How does the Network of Care benefit your organization?



- Providers can share resources with family and friends





Referral Workflow





What is my responsibility as a Network of Care partner organization? What level of buy-in and engagement will be needed from my CBO? From program managers? From referral/intake coordinator?

- Accept referrals from our DHS partner clinics
- Regarding One Degree:
 - regularly update your One Degree page to ensure accuracy
 - designate a staff member to manage referrals from DHS clinics
- Work together to spread the word about your services with DHS clinics

•How does the Network of Care mission fit/align with CBOs current workflow, strategic plan and competing priorities?

• We are working to interrupt cycles of toxic stress that lead to poor health outcomes. Your organization's mission and current work align with our goals.

•Is there a target number of referrals we need to accept/make to keep the license for the two-year period?

• There is no specific target number of referrals, but our hope is that your organization is prepared to accept all referrals from clinics we are linking to you.





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One Degree FAQs

• What is One Degree?

- A web and mobile platform that enables low-income families to find, manage, and review nonprofit and government services. Though primarily client-facing, it is being used by DHS clinics to collate community resources and directly refer to them
- How will my organization receive referrals through One Degree?
 - We will work with you to determine the appropriate way that our clinics will access your organization in One Degree. In general, there are two ways to receive referrals:
 - <u>Closed-Loop</u>: The referral is made to your organization, you will be notified of the referral, and the clinic will be notified when you accept it.
 - <u>Uni-Directional</u>: The referral is made to your organization, you will be notified of the referral, but the clinic will not receive feedback on the status of that referral.
- What is the difference between a Pro vs. Plus account on One Degree.
 - If you work at a nonprofit or government agency and support connecting clients, patients or other community members to local resources, <u>you are a</u> <u>Pro Member</u> and have access to many free services.
 - A PLUS account (available through this partnership) grants your organization direct referral linkages, bi-directional information sharing, and reporting features specific to your partnership with DHS.
 - WE ARE PURCHASING A TWO-YEAR **PLUS** LICENSE FOR YOUR ORGANIZATION.
- Will there be tech support provided by the Network of Care or One Degree?
 - Network of Care Navigators will provide training to staff and field basic technical inquiries (such as how to use/locate features). Technical issues surrounding the function of the One Degree website itself must be addressed to One Degree directly.
- Who do I contact to troubleshoot One Degree?
 - Your Network of Care Navigator should be contacted first. If we can't help with your issue, we'll link you with One Degree technical support for further assistance.
- Will all staff receive One Degree training if we are all making/receiving referrals?
 - Yes, all staff involved in facilitating referrals, both incoming and outgoing, will receive One Degree training.
