

# **REGIONAL CENTER REFERRAL GUIDE**



#### USE THIS GUIDE TO KEEP TRACK OF THE INFORMATION YOU NEEDTO MAKE A REFERRAL TO THE REGIONAL CENTER

**REGIONAL CENTERS** help the California Department of Developmental Services (DDS) coordinate and deliver services for people with developmental disabilities. This includes children who have or are at risk for developmental delays.

**Development** is growth for a child in any of these five areas:

Motor: Moving hands, arms, legs and other body parts to do things

Cognitive: Thinking, reasoning, solving problems

Language and speech: Understanding words, talking, and expressing self

• Social and emotional: Relating to others, understanding and expressing thoughts and feelings without

using words, controlling feelings

Adaptive skills: Caring for and helping self, such as eating, getting dressed, bathing

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#### WHAT CAN THE REGIONAL CENTER DO?

Based on your child's developmental needs and your family's concerns, priorities, and resources, Regional Center services may include:

- Evaluation and diagnosis
- Assistive technology, including devices or services
- Audiology and hearing services
- Counseling, home visits, training for your family
- Community resources
- Nutrition services
- Occupational therapy
- Physical therapy
- Speech and language services

## The Early Start Program provides early intervention services to infants and toddlers with

- a) Developmental delay
- b) High risk for developmental delays or disabilities due to prematurity, prenatal exposure to drugs/alcohol, or having a parent with a developmental disability
- c) An established risk condition for developmental delays such as Down Syndrome or cerebral palsy.

These services help children learn and help families to promote their children's development. Children and their families may receive a variety of services – some families need many services, while others may need only one or two.

**The Lanterman Act** is the California law that says *children with developmental disabilities and their families* have a right to needed services and supports from the Regional Center. **Developmental disabilities** include autism, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, intellectual disability, or anything that makes a child need the same kind of support as someone with an intellectual disability.

The Regional Center

- 1. Gives families information to make good choices about needed services for their child.
- 2. Helps families find and get the needed services.
- 3. Makes sure the services and supports in the community meets their needs. This includes working with schools to help coordinate Special Education services.

#### HOW DO I GET STARTED AT THE REGIONAL CENTER?

Contact the intake department at the Regional Center if you have any of the following concerns –

## If your child is under 3 years old and has:

- a significant delay in at least one area of development
- a condition with a known probability of causing a disability or delay
- at risk for a developmental delay or disability

## If your child is 3 years old and up and has:

- been diagnosed with autism, cerebral palsy, intellectual disability, epilepsy
- any other diagnosis that makes a person need the same kind of support as someone with an intellectual disability
- developmental delays that have not been properly evaluated and you suspect a developmental disability

#### WHO CAN REFER TO THE REGIONAL CENTER?

Anyone can call! Parents, family members, foster parents, doctors, therapists, and teachers... (Professional providers must have the permission of a parent or legal guardian to make a referral.)

#### WHAT HAPPENS AFTER I CONTACT THE REGIONAL CENTER?

- 1. Regional Center receives your information
- 2. You are assigned a service coordinator to begin the process of evaluation for eligibility
- 3. Regional Center will contact you to complete an intake assessment. They will collect information about your child, such as medical records, school records, and prior psychological testing. A diagnostic evaluation involving psychological testing and observation may also be completed. You can expect a phone call from an unknown number, so be sure to answer the call in order to stay on the Regional Center referral list.
- 4. The process to determine eligibility for services should be completed within 45 days.
